The Ralph J. Bunche International Affairs Center, in cooperation with the U.S. Department of State, is inviting qualified College juniors and seniors and others interested, to participate in the **International Affairs Summer Enrichment Program**. This program, which is located at Howard University, is designed to stimulate stronger student interest in international affairs, particularly among African-American and other minority group students, and to generate a deeper understanding and appreciation for career opportunities in international affairs.

This will be a six-week program, for which up to 9 semester hours (three courses) of academic credit in international studies may be awarded. Special emphasis will be placed upon skills, strategies, and knowledge content students will need to master for success in the area of international affairs and in the competitive examination process.

- *History of US Foreign Relations* will place considerable emphasis upon American constitutional process as well as the history of U.S. foreign relations.
- *International Economics* will introduce students to the study of policy behavior of such economic aggregate variables as exchange rate, interest rate, tariffs, balance of trade, and economic integration in open economies.
- *Technical Writing* will develop the student's ability to write logical and convincing arguments and will focus on the analytical and writing skills necessary for successful performance in the competitive examination process.
- All tuition, travel, room, and board will be covered for students accepted into the summer program. They will also receive a stipend of \$3500.

Program Dates: Summer 2004 May 14 - June 25, 2004

Application Deadline: March 5, 2004

Eligibility

- Students must be American citizens, have completed their sophomore year in college and have at least a 3.2 grade point average.

How to Apply

- Official transcript from the College or University the applicant is currently attending or attended
- Three letters of recommendation from faculty members and/or other persons familiar with the accomplishments of the applicant
- One 500 word essay explaining the applicant's interest in international affairs
- Complete page 7 of the Howard Undergraduate Application form
